

Results have shown significant improvement over recent trips. I had a 32 inch 10 pounder on Thursday, January 24th, and my customers have caught a couple of 28 and 29 inchers recently too. We are also seeing better numbers of fish in the 25 to 28 inch class. Best bite is on sinking Corkies and full-sized topwaters like Spooks and Skitterwalks early in the mornings. Soft plastics work much better later in the day, especially under bright skies. The fish are wanting to be shallow with all the recent warm weather. Most of our big bites have come from fish in about twenty to thirty inches of water. Parts of the area continue to be plagued by brown tide, but the level of the bloom isn't too bad; other parts of the area are holding crystal clear water. Some of the big fish are biting in the brown stuff. The SCB tournament held on January 25 and 26 revealed good potential over coming months too. Several trout over 7 pounds were brought to the scales, the biggest at 8 1/4. As near as we can tell, some of these fish were caught in brown tide stained waters. My friend and partner Jason King caught two 29s, two 28s, a 27 and a 26 during the two days of the event, some in brown tide, some in clear water. He was using Provoker soft plastics throughout.
