

Fishing is fast lately for small trout when the weather is in a normal pattern, meaning the wind dies down to 10 mph or lighter for several hours in the morning. The water quality around the Land Cut is best, and clear water stretches all the way up to the Meadows at times. The fish can be found on shallow, grassy flats early in the morning. Bite is better on deep grass edges and along main drop offs later in the day. Spook Juniors, Corkies and MirrOdines are all working well on the flats early. Soft plastics and MirrOprops work better when the sun is higher. On windier days, the fishing is much much tougher. Floating grass becomes more of an issue and many of the best deep spots are impossible to fish. Speaking of deep, the tide has been standing quite high (14.4 and higher) for the last week or more. This creates a problem in locating fish. The shallow fish spread out over a larger area, so they become hard to find. The deep fish probably stay where they are, but wading to them become impossible.
